

Statement of Democratic Principles

The Victorian Registration Standards (VRQA) (sch 4 cl 1 and sch 8 cl 1) (CECV Guidelines ref 1.1 and 8.1) require that the programs of and teaching at CBC St Kilda must support and promote the principles and practice of Australian democracy.

These include a commitment to:

- elected Government
- the rule of law
- equal rights for all before the law
- freedom of religion
- freedom of speech and association
- the values of openness and tolerance
